Internship: An internship with a nonprofit, NGO, or a local government may be beneficial.

Duties and Responsibilities: The Gender Based Violence (GBV) Specialist is responsible for coordinating the GBV program. This includes quality control, reporting, analysis and policy setting as well as coordination of different teams and partners. The objective of this role is to provide GBV prevention and response to affected populations. GBV Specialists are likely to focus on one or more specific areas of GBV such as case management, legal/justice, community services, GBVIM, mental health and psycho-social support services, sexual and reproductive health in emergencies, early and forced marriage, or other areas. Depending on the affected populations and the context of the missions, the main duties will vary accordingly.

Work Environment: Most GBV Specialists may work in office settings, some GBV Specialists work in field-based or community settings where GBV is prevalent or where humanitarian crises, conflict, or displacement have heightened vulnerability to violence.

Work Schedule: Many GBV Specialists work standard full-time hours during regular business hours. GBV Specialists may need to be flexible with their work schedules to accommodate the needs of survivors and communities affected by gender-based violence.

Career Path/Promotion: As individuals gain experience and expertise in addressing GBV issues, they may advance to mid-level positions with increased responsibility and leadership opportunities. With significant experience and demonstrated leadership abilities, GBV Specialists may advance to senior leadership positions within nonprofit organizations, government agencies, international organizations, or research institutions.

Education, Training and Certification: Many GBV Specialists begin their careers by obtaining a relevant undergraduate degree. While not always required, some GBV Specialists pursue advanced degrees to enhance their qualifications and opportunities for career advancement.
